Think of it as a construction investigation – a tool intended to help you write the beginning of your home's transformation story and visualize how it ends.

  - Investigate zoning and building permits
  - Develop a preliminary scope
  - Understand how design and product selection affect cost
  - Establish a control estimate to monitor the project during construction and product selection

### Where - Ways to save

- Plan ahead
- Think about use and function above all else efficiency, not size, is most important spaces can be dual-use
- Keep an open mind about design, materials and scope of work
- Consider lighting utilize natural, limit recessed, maintain window size

### Why - Why are you REALLY considering a project?

- Think through the Who? and What? again
- Prioritize your reasons
- Narrow your scope by eliminating the least important reasons
- Fill in the blanks

- Keep the "why" in mind throughout the process
